Tigers top Dogs after first-half onslaught

GLENELG continued its impressive start to the season with a powerful 34-point win against Central District yesterday at Elizabeth.

Brett Hand made it three wins from three as Tigers coach after his hard-running, high-pressure side added to first-up victories against West Adelaide and reigning premiers the Eagles by kicking away from the Bulldogs thanks to a dominant first-half performance.

The Bulldogs, who began the season with an impressive home win against North Adelaide before a second-half fadeout against Port Adelaide, looked in danger of being swept aside in the first half, but the Tigers' inaccurate goalkicking left it with a wasteful 510 on the board at half-time.

"The way we played in the first quarter was exactly the way I want to play," Hand said.

"The way we went about it with our pressure and attack at the footy was what I have been trying to instil in the boys."

Central fought hard in the second half, refusing to buckle despite trailing by seven goals early in the third quarter and strung together some promising patches of footy.

Bulldogs coach Paul Thomas could not question his players' endeavour or their willingness to play for each other and was pleased with the fight they showed when it looked like Glenelg could kick away. "We just needed to be consistent for longer periods of time," he said.

With ruckman Jack Hannath improving every week,
Luke Partington, Brett Turner,
Matthew Snook and Darcy
Bailey damaging through the
midfield and with a host of
dangerous forwards ready to
make an impact, Glenelg is
showing it is on the right track
to playing finals footy for the
third successive season.

And its defence looks rocksolid, co-captain Chris Curran, Max Proud and Sam Durdin working well together.
