GLENELG'S centenary season celebrations remain in full swing after it overcame a massive scare from Sturt to stretch its unbeaten start to the year to six games with a thrilling four-point win at the Bay yesterday.

The Tigers will enter the bye round as the SANFL's only unbeaten side after a late goal from key forward Luke Reynolds saved them from an upset loss to a well-drilled Double Blues outfit.

Reynolds marked and goaled from the edge of the goalsquare at the Phillis End of Glenelg Oval to put his side in front for good with two minutes remaining after it had surrendered an 18-point lead midway through the last quarter. Ash Johnson ap-

peared set to be Sturt's hero for the second consecutive week after he gave Martin Mattner's gallant outfit the lead 22 minutes into the final term following his matchwinning goal against Adelaide the previous week.

But with a big boilover on the cards, Glenelg dug deep as it has so often this year - to pinch its sixth straight win deep into time-on.

Reynolds' goal - his third of the day - was set up by some clever work from fellow forwards Marlon Motlop and Darcy Bailey.

"It's good to win ugly sometimes," said first-year Bays coach Brett Hand, who is yet to taste defeat at Tigerland. "Credit to our boys at the end there for doing what they did, to work so hard to get that last goal, it was pleasing to see that happen.

"It was disappointing to lose that three-goal lead late but good teams find a way to win, which we did.

"At the moment we're not as good as I'd like us to be but full credit to Marty and the Sturt boys because they came to play and they played a really high pressure game."

In a seesawing contest, Glenelg led by eight points at quarter-time and two at the long break but fell 13 points behind in the third term.

A run of five unanswered goals saw it break 18 points clear halfway through the final quarter before the Double Blues came storming home, kicking 3.2 without reply to snatch a two-point lead.

Johnson kicked two of the goals, including the one that
