Crows in big flag warning

Adelaide continued to mount its case for serious majorround action with a convincing win against top side Glenelg at the Bay on Saturday.

Leading at each break the Crows produced close to their best form of the season to win by 20 points, inflicting the Tigers' first loss since falling to Sturt away in round 1.

The Crows' running power and connection were evident from the start. Suffocating the Bays' usual strength in finding clear targets the Crows were all over the home side, at one stage in the third quarter leading the inside-50 count 43-18, finishing with 59 for the day.

Leading by 17 points at halftime the Crows flicked the switch in the third to take a 46point buffer into the last term, keeping Glenelg to 1.1 to 5.6. But the Bays finally found some spark and space with four early goals in the last quarter and 13 scoring shots for the period but an opportune goal to Crow Billy Dowling against the flow stemmed the tide.

Adelaide had plenty of top performers, Matt Crouch as usual among the best with 32 disposals and seven clearances. Harry Schoenberg also starred with 28 touches, while Kieran Strachan (46 hit-outs, two goals) and Elliott Himmelberg (four goals, one in each quarter and 28 hit-outs) were dynamic. Dowling also was solid in one of his best games.

Crows coach Mick Godden said his side was excellent.

cluding the big fellows Strachan and Himmelberg, who kicked four goals and probably played his best game for us. You always get a consistent game from Kieran, he keeps fronting up and doing the job."

For the Bays, Jonty Scharenberg was strong with 23 disposals, while Corey Lyons, Matt Snook and Brett Turner were prominent. Ever-reliable key forwards Lachlan Hosie and Liam McBean were terrific with four goals each but suffered from a lack of supply at times, particularly in the second and third quarters.

Tigers coach Darren Reeves said there were no excuses.

"Full credit to the Crows, we couldn't match them early and they were much cleaner with their ball movement," he said.

"We needed to execute better and couldn't but we will learn from it. You want to keep winning but this comp is so hard to do that. We will take a lot out of the game." It is always a great challenge when you come up against the Adelaide Crows. As was the case in our first contest a few weeks back, they can move the ball quickly and apply score pressure on you in a short space of time. This occurred again on Saturday, as they were able to grab the ascendancy in the game from early on. It is important to grab hold of the score opportunities when they present, and while we didn't do that in the first quarter, the start of the second quarter was positive and we were able to gain some nice momentum

and apply some pressure of our own. Some missed opportunities always come back to hurt, and conceding some cheap goals leading into half time was far from ideal. We were left with some work to do in to the second half of the game.

Our third quarter wasn't great, and to the Adelaide's credit they were very good and we were not able to match their intensity and effort for long enough through that period. There are some great learnings out of this which we will certainly look at closely. In this competition against high quality opposition, you cannot drop off in these areas, and while we have been solid for a long period of time, this is just a good reminder that we still have lots of improving to work on.

We had a clear focus in the last quarter to get ourselves back into the game from a physical standpoint, and from there stay really brave with the ball in hand. We take away some positives in that we were able to do that and felt we had some strong moments throughout this final term. Thirteen scoring shots reflected that, but we don't hide away from the fact we didn't do well enough in the first three quarters.

Our Reserves team continued with their impressive brand of football and consistency in all areas. We were really pleased with the effort to keep challenging the opposition ball in hand. Equally the intent and endeavour around contest was pleasing to see. A mixture of experienced players and some of our younger players continue to play at a consistently high level and keep the pressure on the players above them to keep performing, not just in games but throughout training also.
