Tigers back to their best and on top again

Glenelg sealed its third minor premiership in five years and gained the all-important week off in the first round of the finals with a convincing 10-goal win against South Adelaide at the Bay on Saturday.

The Tigers overcame a tardy start to dominate the second half, kicking the last nine goals, to set up a second semi-final showdown against the winner of next Sunday's qualifying final between Adelaide and Sturt.

In an emotional day for the Panthers, who farewelled veteran stars Bryce Gibbs, Matthew Broadbent and Matt Rose, Glenelg struggled early and led by only five points midway through the third quarter before over-running the short-handed visitors, who lost Broadbent (concussion) and Ben Shillabeer (hamstring) to first-half injuries.

Broadbent's final game lasted only 13 minutes after he was dazed in a strong tackle from Brady Searle.

The Tigers found their groove in the second half to take some confidence into the finals. South did not kick a goal after Damon Freitag's major nine minutes into the third term left it trailing by only five points. Utility Matthew Allen (26 disposals, three goals), key forward Liam McBean (20 disposals, four goals) and midfielder Corey Lyons (29 disposals, eight clearances) were the driving forces in Glenelg's victory while full forward Lachie Hosie's two goals saw him claim his first Ken Farmer Medal as SANFL leading goalkicker. He finished with 52 for the year - nine more than runner-up McBean, who has won the Medal three times.

"We are happy finishing top, we think it's the best avenue going in (to the finals)," said Glenelg coach Darren Reeves,

who steered his side to the minor premiership in his first year in charge. while former AFL star Gibbs signed off with a drop kick in the final term in a tribute to his dad, Ross, who famously produced one in the last quarter of Glenelg's 1985 grand final win against North Adelaide. "We lost our legs midway

through the third quarter, with some early injuries not helping, but Glenelg was far superior," coach Jarrad Wright said. "We turned the ball over too

much, which made us have to defend for long periods, and that's just not sustainable and has been our Achilles heel all year. It's been a disappointing, frustrating year but we'll grow from it."
